County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations
me thereunto moving as also in further consideration of the sum of ten dollars
to me in hand paid have released from slavery liberated manumitted and set
free and by these presents do ^{hereby} release from slavery ^{liberate} manumitted and set free
my negro man named Frost being of the age of thirty five years and
able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance
and him the said Negro man named Frost I do declare to be henceforth
free manumitted and discharged from all manner of servitude to
me my executor or administrator forever In Testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this ~~twelfth~~ ^{thirteenth} day
of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and twenty eight April the 13th 1828
