Spence for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and sixty four ^{and} current money of Maryland, to him in hand paid by the said William H. Bell and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof the said Thomas R. Spence doth hereby acknowledge, and from every part and parcel thereof doth hereby acquit, exonerate and discharge the said William H. Bell his heirs, Executors and administrators he the said Thomas R. Spence hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed, confirmed, and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey and confirm, unto the said William H. Bell his heirs and assigns forever, all of his right, title, interest and claim in and to a tract of Land situated and lying in Worcester County aforesaid called Ming or by whatever other name or names the same or called - supposed to contain six hundred acres more or less, being the same lands lately deceased, together with all and singular the buildings, improvements, woods, ways, waters, water courses, rights, liberties, privileges, benefits, advantages, incidents, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the arrears and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof, and all the estate right title and interest whatsoever of the said Thomas R. Spence both at Law and in Equity of in, to and out of the said lands and premises hereby bargained and sold or meant, mentioned, or intended hereby so to be and every or any part and parcel thereof, to have and to hold the said lands and
